



To mark our 80th show, this year we decided to incorporate our stunning Snowy River and hold not only ours, but Australia's first ever platypus race! 80 general entry platypus and 20 corporate entry platypus will race down the river in town to the finish line at the weir.

Dalgety is very proud of its platypus population, and has one of the healthiest populations of platypus in NSW, with a number of our platypus having recently been relocated to the Royal National Park to facilitate their new breeding program. The race will commence at 2pm, so please find a good viewing spot before then. All competing platypus entries have already been purchased prior to the show, however there will be a very limited amount of unpainted platypus for sale at the showbag bunker should you wish to purchase one.
